Status report on implementation of the Scheduled Tribes and Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (Recognition of Forest Rights) Act, 2006 [for the period ending 30th April, 2010]

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1. Readiness of the States in the implementation of the Act :

- (i) An updated status of State-wise implementation of the Act is given in **Annexure-I**. As per the information collected till 30th April 2010, **more than 27.99 lakh claims have been filed and more than 9.03 lakh titles have been distributed. More than 4 thousand 8 hundred titles were ready for distribution.**

State-wise synopsis of claims disposed of, as on 30.04.10, with respect to the total number of claims received up to May 09, the month of announcement of special drive, is as below:

Trend Charts in **Annexure-III**. From the said trend charts, it is seen that in the States of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Chhattisgarh, Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerala, Maharashtra, Orissa, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal, the number of claims received has reached a plateau. In the States of Bihar, Jharkhand, and Uttarakhand the number of claims filed so far is still very little.

Barring few pockets of land under wildlife sanctuaries, reserved forests, most of the land in entire State is community land.
