

APPENDIX-VII

RIGHTS AND CONCESSIONS:

NARASINGPUR EX-STATE

'A' CLASS RESERVED FORESTS

No rights exist.

The following concessions have however been allowed in the Narasingpur State Forest Rules, 1933 and declarations made by the ~~the State Government~~ gazette dated 4th August, 1947.

'A' Class Reserves-(Rule 15, 16 & 17 of Narasingpur Forest Rules, 1933)

The cess paying tenants and the aboriginal tribes are allowed to collect edible roots, fruits, creeper, dry fuel and such items of Minor Forest Produce as have not been leased out, free of payment for their own personal consumption. They are allowed to take bamboo at half the royalty rate and timber of reserved species at full rate from the current coupes of the year. Grazing is allowed for all kind of cattle excepting sheep and goat on payment of grazing fee.

'B' Class Reserves-(Rule 23, 24, 25 & 30 of Narasingpur Forest Rules, 1938)

The cess paying tenants are allowed to take unreserved species and fire wood free of royalty and reserved species at half the schedule of rate for their own domestic consumption and not for sale or barter or gift. They are allowed to remove salia bamboos at Rs. 0-7-0 (Rs. 0.44 paise) per 100 for their own use.

The residents were entitled to free grazing but it has been abolished as per order No. 4076/D of Govt. of Orissa dated 31st March, 1954. They are allowed to graze their cattle on payment of grazing fee.

Khesra Forest-(Rule 34, 35, 37, 38, 39, 40, 42, 46 & 56 of Narasingpur Forest Rules, 1933)

Every resident of the state is entitled to get fire wood, grass, bamboos, creepers, stone, red earth, trees of unreserved species free of charge and reserved species at concession rate in reasonable quantities for their own bonafide use. They are allowed to graze their cattle free.

at Re.0-4-0 per family from 1953-54. 13 Villages of outside Kujang containing 269 families are allowed to remove at 100 maunds fuel each per year on payment of Bonker at Re.0-8-0 per family.

d-Anchal staff of Kujang get free permit for 30 maunds of fuel per year. d-This was stopped from the 1st August 1956, in virtue of Board order No.7751/E.A. date the 28th July 1956

e-B.E.H.E. School Kujang get free permit for 800 maunds of fuel for the hostel students. e- Ditto.

f-Fire afflicted persons are given permits for reconstruction of their houses. f-This is allowed to continued.

g-Pan cultivators (early cultivators, are allowed certain concessions in the schedule of rates and new cultivators are allowed to remove materials at full scheduled rates. g-The prevesting practice is allowed to continued.

HARISPUR EX-ZAMINDARY AREAS

Before vesting

a-The fisherman of Rohna village were allowed their annual requirements from the forests of Harispur on payment Rs.5/- for whole village

After vesting

a-This is allowed to continue till the 31st July 1956 and discontinued as per Board's Order 7751/EA., Dated the 28th July 1956.

EX-ZAMINDARY AREA

Rights and concessions enjoyed by the tenants in different Ex-Zamindar order is furnished below.

KUJANG EX-ZAMINDARY

Before vesting

a-The tenants of Killa Kujang are allowed to remove the following forest materials on payment of Bonker(Forest Cess)at Rs.0-4-0 per family per year in three instalments.

Aswino and Karthiko 10 maunds fuel...

Third instalment-

b-Keutos (Fishermen)of Kujang had the privilege of removing forest produce for their annual requirements free of cost.

c-Kumbharos (Potters)of Killa Kujang had the privilege of removing forest produce for their annual requirements free of cost.

After vesting

a-This is being continued.

b-Keutos of Kujang are permitted free removals Board of Revenue during the year 1952-53, 1953-54, 1954-55 and 1955-56, From the 13th April, 1956 Bonker at Re.0-4-0 per family was assessed on all Keutos as per Boards Order No.685/E.A. date 15th February, 56.

c-This was discontinued and are permitted to remove 100 maunds of fuel and house materials on payment of Bonker

'B' Class Reserves Forests or D.P.F.S.

The tenants of the state are allowed to collect timber of reserved species and fire wood at half the rates. Minor Forest Produce free of cost and Bamboo @ Rs.0.6.0 (Rs.0.37 paise) per 100.

Khesra or Unreserved or U.D.P.Fs:-

The tenants are allowed to collect timber on payment of prescribed fees, fire wood of unreserved species free and reserved species at half the schedule of rates. They can collect bamboos & Minor Forest Produce free of cost and allowed free grazing.

Nistar Cess:-

Re.0.1.6 (Rs.0.09 paise) per acre of wet land

Re.0.0.9 (Rs.0.05 paise) per acre of dry land

Non-cultivators @ Rs.0.4.0 (Rs.0.25 paise) per house per annum.

BALABANPUR EX-ZAMINDARY FORESTS

DALIJOFA SADAR EX-ZAMINDARY AREAS

The rights and concessions enjoyed during Zamindary period are being continued. The resident tenants of Killa Dalijora are entitled to get fuel for their own domestic use and materials for repairing their houses and agricultural implements on payment of Re.1 per each family. This is allowed from the 1st. November to the 31st March each year.

The resident tenants of adjoining villages of Killa Dalijora are also allowed to take fuel on payment of Re.0-8-0 per each cart load and this concessions is allowed from the 1st November to the 31st March each year. The tenants can obtain Jhatis, Khaas (bamboo pieces) etc. for protecting their crop during the period from November to March every year.

DHALTANGARI EX-ZAMINDARY AREA

There is no right of people in the Forest. During the Anchal period permits were issued for dry fuel at Rs.2/- per cart load and at Rs.0.4.0 per head load of brush wood.

KAIJANGA EX-ZAMINDARY AREA

Before the date of vesting the people used to enjoy the privileges of taking the branches of the bamboos for the purpose of fencing. These privileges have been allowed to continue after vesting.

- b-Kumbhars of Harisipur were getting their annual requirements of fuel and other materials free of cost. b-This was discontinued and are allowed to pay Bonker as other tenants.
- c-Kondras (Moliks) were getting their annual requirements free of cost. c-This was discontinued.
- d-Tenants other than the above three classes who pay chowkidari tax and who wishes to remove forest materials pay half the tax in Harisipur and full tax in Bishnupur subject to a minimum of Re.0-8-0 (Rs.0.50 paise) d-This was continued after vesting, but the quantity of removals were limited to 4 cart loads of fuel noi, botha and one set of ploughs.
- e-All Ex-Estate employees were to get free fuel. e-This was discontinued from the 1st August, 1956 as per Board Orders.

MORCHIPUR EX-ZAMINDARY AREAS

- a-The people of this area take dry fuel by paying Bonker at Re.0-4-0 per married couple. a-This is being continued from 1957-58 the census have been taken and Bonker demand fixed from early 6 villages of Jagatsinghpur Anchal used to get this Concession from Morchipur, but from 1957-58 these 6 villages are not allowed removals on Bonker but on royalty basis.

KILPAL EX-ZAMINDARY AREAS

- a-No rules and rates were in vogue. a-Rules and rates introduced from the 1st Sept. 1956.

MADHUPUR EX-ZAMINDARY AREAS

On the 1st February 1953 the Ex-Anchal Adhikari Darpani issued a notification allowing the tenants of the area to have their requirements from the village forests cess at Re1 per family if they went to remove the produce by means of carts. But those who went to remove their requirements by head loads they will have to pay Rs.3.50 per annum per family. Until the Reserve Forest and village forests are determined, the tenants may have their requirements from any forest of the area. But those who went to trade on the forest produce must pay at the present schedule of rate. This practice is being followed now.

(b) Free grazing was allowed but have subsequently been abolished vide Govt. of Orissa, Development Department No. 4076/D dated the 31st March, 1954.

Class Reserves:

(a) Persons paying annual forest cess will be given free permits to remove unreserved trees for their own consumption and not for sale or barter. The royats of the state are allowed free of payment to collect fruits, flowers and leaves in reasonable quantity for their domestic use.

(b) Free grazing was allowed. But Govt. in the order No. 4076/D dated the 31st March, 1954 have stopped such free grazing. They have to pay fees at current schedule of rate for grazing.

(c) The following concession was allowed in the extra ordinary Gazette dated 8.4.1940 (Item No. II) but it was not implemented. "Every village will be allotted blocks of forests as Khesra and protected Forest as close to the village as possible which the villagers will use free of any charge for all purpose such as fuel, agricultural implements, Jhati, medha, house building materials etc. and the use of ~~some~~ such forests will be regulated by the village Panchayats."

(a) Khesra Forests:- In Khesra Forest, tenants are allowed unreserved species free of charge and reserved species at concession rate. All minor forest produce including bamboos are allowed free. Grazing is allowed free.

ATHGARH EX-STATE

The following rights and concessions have been allowed as per Rules 26, 28, 30 & 34 of Rules for preservation and Management of Athgarh State Forest-1924 and item Nos. 10, 11, 12 & 13 of 'Athgarh State extra ordinary Gazette of 8.4.1940'.

'A' Class Reserves:-

(a) In case of calamities, such as fire accidents, wash out by flood etc. free supply of necessary timber and bamboos will be allowed to the affected villagers from the Reserved Forests. Only in case of well-to-do persons half the royalty will be charged for such supply.

(3) Digging of roots of a tree, cutting of young bamboos shoots and cutting of bamboos less than 18 months old are prohibited.

Unreserved trees and all Minor Forest Produce may be felled, collected and removed free of charge by aboriginal tribes, persons exempted from Nistar cess on the ground of poverty and landless labourers being bonafide residents of the state, Provided such produce is for personal use only.

TIGIRIA EX-STATE

The following rights and concessions have been granted as per Tigiria Forest Rules, 1931 and Annual Administration Report of 1945-46.

There are no 'A' class reserved forests.

'B' Class Reserved Forests.:-The tenants paying nistar cess are entitled to take unreserved species free and reserved species at concession rate. The grazing was allowed free but Govt. in their letter order No. 4076/D., date the 31st March, 1954 have been pleased to stop

'B' Class Reserves (Rule-23, 24, 25, 32 & 33 of Baramba Forest Rules, 1933)

The tenants of the state paying Nistar cess enjoy the following rights and concessions.

(a) The right to take free of cost.

(i) Unreserved species.

(ii) Materials of reserved species for the manufacture of carts, cart-wheels, oil mills, sugar cane mills and agricultural implements.

(b) To take at concession rates reserved species for purpose, other than those mentioned in (a)(ii) above provided that the rights and concessions in (a) & (b) shall be exercised at such times in such places and in such manner as may be directed by the authority, provided further that the tenants may be allowed to take fuel of reserved species free of cost when such exploitation is restricted to definite areas and definite times. Provided further that the tenants may exercise these rights and concessions in respect of produce for their own bonafide requirements.

(c) Ghooting for the manufacture of lime may be removed by cess payers free of royalty for their own personal use.

(d) Honey and wax may be collected by bonafide residents provided trees are not felled or fired in the process of collection.

(e) Free grazing was allowed but has subsequently been abolished vide Govt. of Orissa, Development Department Notification No. 4076-D dt. 31st March, 1954. Grazing is allowed on payment at current schedule of rates.

Khesra Forest (Rule-35, 37, 41, 42, 43, 44 & 48 of Baramba State Forest Rules, 1933)

By virtue of Nistar cess paid by them the tenants of the state are entitled, subject to restriction mentioned below, to take free of cost unreserved species in reasonable quantity for their own bonafide use, but not for sale, barter or gift. If they desire to cut trees of reserved species a permit at concession rate must first be obtained and the trees must be marked.

The following are the restrictions.

(1) No tree of any species whether reserved or not growing on the bank of any tank, wafer course, stream or within 30' from the centre of a road or any state building shall be cut.

(2) No large tree of any kind having a girth exceeding 5' which is used as a shelter for the cattle or is growing in the boundary of any village may be cut.

Re.0.1.0 (Rs.0.6 paise) per acre of Sarad land, Re.0.0.6. (Rs.0.03 paise) per acre of Beja fasal land and persons with home-stead land Re.0.4.0 (Rs.0.25 paise) to Re.0.2.0 (Rs.12 paise) according to circumstances.

Annual demand of cess = Rs.1000/-

BARAMBA EX-STATE

'A' CLASS RESERVES.

No rights exist.

The following concessions have been allowed as per rule 15, 16 & 17 of Baramba Forest Rules, 1933.

(a) Grazing is allowed in the Reserved Forest for all kinds of cattle except sheep and goat on payment of annual fee at schedule of rate.

(b) The residents of the state are permitted to collect edible roots, fruits, creepers and dry fuel for own personal consumption free of payment and such items of Minor Forest Produce as have not been leased out. Such produce must not be sold or gifted to any other person nor shall any prescriptive right to collect produce in the Reserved Forests accrue through the exercise of this concession.
